- e) Council Funds (Sharon)
 - i) Ongoing discussion for over a year regarding funds in the account. Long discussions around shade outside. Discussed the pros and cons with needing shade. New administration had an additional meeting regarding shade. Met Regional Facilities Supervisor there has been a change in procedure; now if we wanted to install a large structure we would need to write a detailed report/proposal the proposal goes to the elementary accommodation committee. The supervisor indicated this would be a procedure would not guarantee it would go through. If we were successful, there would be no Approved vendors it would go to a tender

- process. They decide which one to pick, not us. Long-term maintenance and quality board will not allow staff to maintain it. It would be the council who would have to maintain it. Julia and Sharon are recommended not to move forward and pivot to a different option for Shade. Proposal would be to put in a different option.
- ii) Feedback from the group regarding shade. Agreement not to have something we cannot maintain
- iii) Proposal for another option: proving 2 to 20-30 foot trees, large shade. Ballpark quote: 5-10 thousand per tree, 25 thousand for trees wanting to provide trees. Setting aside 10 thousand for wish list items in anticipation of proposals for teachers. two thousand dollar request from the grade 7 and 8s to go to the bluejay game (to subsidize it). Kindie Pen is still unfinished. proposal includes to enhance the kindergarten area. Questions around tree maintenance. Would like to have a clear plan by February 10 to spend the proposed plan. Would like a detailed plan on what would happen with the Kindie pen.
 - 1) Tara motioned to approved 2,000.00 to subsidized the bus for the grade 7 and 8s, Crystal 2nd all in favour
 - 2) Table: assembly costs for white hatter, shade whether to move forward or not for the Shade structure.
